You do not have to pay.



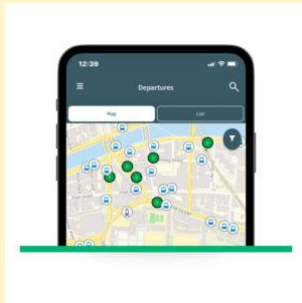
It is available to people aged 18 and older.
